3) Okeechobee County Activities Report

Deborah Manzo, Okeechobee County Administrator, updated the Council on current activities in Okeechobee County.

4) Adoption of the Comprehensive Economic Development Strategy (CEDS) 2023 Update

The CFRPC serves as the Economic Development District for the Central Florida Region, as designated by the US Economic Development Administration (EDA). One role of the EDD is to develop and maintain the five-year Comprehensive Economic Development Strategy (CEDS) for the region, including updating the CEDS annually. CFRPC Program Manager Beneshea Frazier briefed the Council on updates to the CEDS.

5) 2023 U.S. Department of Commerce Economic Development Administration (EDA) Partnership Planning Grant FY 2024 – 2027

The Central Florida Regional Planning Council serves as an Economic Development District (EDD). In accordance with Economic Development Administration guidelines, staff will submit the Partnership Planning grant application for FY 2024-27. This grant funds the coordination, preparation and maintenance of the EDD's Comprehensive Economic Development Strategy (CEDS) and allows the EDD to provide technical assistance to communities throughout the region. CFRPC Executive Director Jennifer Codo-Salisbury explained the importance of this grant program in relation to economic development and disaster recovery in the region.

Each year the CFRPC submits requests to the Florida Department of Transportation for FTA funding. The annual grant applications are for operating and capital support the Transportation Disadvantaged Program, rural transit services and mobility management programs in DeSoto, Hardee, Highlands, and Okeechobee counties. CFRPC Transportation Director Marybeth Soderstrom provided an overview of these programs.



Background: In August 2023, the Central Florida Regional Planning Council was awarded a grant from the US Department of Defense, Office of Local Defense Community Cooperation to support a Military Installation Resiliency Review (MIRR) project for the Avon Park Air Force Range in the amount of \$462,915, to be completed by January 2025.

This project integrates critical military and community resilience concerns into the strategies, plans, and investments of surrounding municipalities to foster, protect, and create a resilient future that considers the unique contributions of the Avon Park Air Force Range. This project will be led by the CFRPC, building upon our strong relationships with Range personnel, military leadership, municipal and county governments, economic development organizations, Sentinel Landscape partners, and the State of Florida.

With collaboration from key stakeholders, the Project Team will:

- Conduct a comprehensive review of present and forecasted natural and man-made threats and vulnerabilities;
- Perform table-top exercises with local military and community (public and private) leadership to review capacities of hard infrastructure such as transportation networks, electricity, communications, and water supply, and the public services necessary to respond to natural and/or man-made disruptions.
- · Develop community partnerships;
- Model impacts from potential threats and geospatial mapping; and
- Develop a Cost-benefit analysis of implementation options.

Staff issued a Request for Proposals for a MIRR and received three proposals listed below.

- Marstel-Day
- Stantec
- Converge Strategies

The Selection Committee met on November 30, 2023 to evaluate and rank the Proposals. **Marstel-Day ranked first and Stantec was ranked second**.

Staff requests the Board approve the Selection Committee's rankings and authorize the Executive Director to negotiate and execute a contract for this project consistent with the grant.
