
Hurricane Irma...2017

- Landfall September 10, 2017
- 1st Category 4 since Hurricane Charley in 2004
- Sustained winds of 100⁺ mph
- ~16,000 people in shelters
- Schools closed for 12 days
- 10 deaths
- \$56⁺ million in debris claims
- 2⁺ billion in crop loss
- 1.5 billion in visitor spending loss
- ~8.6 billion in insurance loss



Hurricane Irma...2017

- Declaration
 - Highlands and Polk Counties were listed as Tier 2 Hurricane Irma most impacted Counties
 - Economic Development Administration - Economic Development Assistance Programs Grant
 - December 2017 CFRPC received grant award for a "Recovery Coordinator Position"



Disaster Recovery Reform Act of 2018

- Effective October 5, 2018
- 50 Provisions
- Acknowledges the shared responsibility for disaster response and recovery
- Aims to reduce the complexity of FEMA
- Build the nation's capacity for the next catastrophic event.



Rebuild Florida (Hurricane Irma Housing Repair and Replacement Program)

- DeSoto:
 - 154 registered
 - 137 invited to apply
- Hardee:
 - 37 registered
 - 31 invited to apply
- Highlands:
 - 269 registered
 - 234 invited to apply
- Okeechobee:
 - 19 registered
 - 18 invited to apply
- Polk:
 - 925 registered
 - 813 invited to apply



DEO - Voluntary Home Buyout Program

- Available Funds: \$75,000,000
- Option 1: Use funds to match projects eligible in the Hazard Mitigation Grant Program (as listed in Local Mitigation Plans)
- Option 2: Use funds to acquire contiguous parcels and to acquire property from low- to moderateincome households that did not have flood insurance at the time of Hurricane Irma
- Applications due October 1, 2019



Rebuild Florida - Infrastructure Repair Program

- Available Funds: \$85,813,653
- Option 1: Use funds for Infrastructure Restoration and Improvement Projects
- Option 2: Use funds for match for other federal programs when used to carry out an eligible federal Community Development Block Grant Disaster Recovery infrastructure activity
- Applications due August 28, 2019



Rebuild Florida/Florida Housing – Affordable Workforce Housing Construction Program

- Total Available Funds: \$140,000,000
- <u>RFA 2019-102</u>
 - The grant is due August 27, 2019 by 3:00pm.
 - Funds Available:
 - \$88,000,000 for construction of new affordable rental housing (Development Funding)
 - \$10 million for acquiring land that will be held in perpetuity (Land Acquisition Program Funding). If applying as a Priority I Application, land must remain affordable in Perpetuity.
- <u>RFA 2019-103</u>
 - The grant is due August 29, 2019 by 3:00pm.
 - Funds Available:
 - \$20 million for construction of affordable small Developments consisting of no more than 50 units
