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### 4. New Business

Rick with DeSoto County Emergency Management is looking forward to being more proactive in the future.

Appointment for a new Vice-Chair for the CF-LEPC is needed. The LEPC is looking for nominations for Vice Chair. Codi Donahoe, Polk County Fire Rescue, was suggested as filing the seat and was nominated by Dan Bartell. Attendees agreed.

EV batteries were discussed recently in an email from Rob Dieterich with FDEM, Dan responded to the email with more information. This will possibly be the subject of the SERC training/taskforce meeting and the information will be brought back to the LEPC.

There were no incident report(s) for the Region.

The recent SERC meeting was reviewed and discussed with those in attendance. Curtis shared that within our region, hazardous materials were released on three separate occasions, the incidents were reported to the state watch office. Talks across the state regarding hazardous incidents show Florida looking at a decrease in incidents. Activities related to incidents in the last 10 years were also included in the meeting packet for members to review. Addition of Tier II data was also included in the packet.

# 5. Subcommittee Reports

Elissa Walls from Lineage Logistics membership application will be presented in the July SERC meeting.

Ashley and Curtis reviewed recent topics of discussion from the past SERC meeting. SERC training topics included: EV batteries and PFASs (Perfluoroalkyl Substances) disposal options. We would like to open PFASs training for all fire departments to encourage one large disposal instead of many small i.e. amnesty day. New modifications in regulations regarding drinking water were also a topic of discussion. There will be another Offshore Hazmat Pilot training class in July for response training. The State is also trying to find funding for fentanyl training for first responders across the state.

Dan Bartle shared how important it is to understand the needs for PFASs mitigation/training. He shared that PFASs is a standard material in the lining of firefighter gear, so all firefighters across the country are putting PFASs on their bodies. Some departments are updating their operations to change that.

Curtis shared some stats from the meeting: The 2022 Hazmat Symposium had 595 students attended, 64 training sessions. 20 vendors, 75 instructors and 204 hours of training. Upcoming training includes the ability to bring locally CSX rail car workshops. Curtis will send out contact information for this training. Recently the state took back \$10k from the LEPC grants and several



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others to help with their own funding. The state is hopeful that the approval of additional grants might be helpful with their budget shortfall. Curtis will share RMP schedules for facilities getting inspected in our region.
